




But David and his people saw beyond that reality, their confidence was not in Horses and Chariots, but in the God

The prayer begins in this way: "May the Lord answer you in the day of trouble; May the name of the God of Jacob defend you; May He send you help from the sanctuary, And strengthen you out of Zion; May He remember all your offerings, And accept your burnt sacrifice. May He grant you according to your heart's desire, and fulfill all your purpose." Psalm 20:1-4. In other words, the people of David were trusting that God will keep David safe and were confident that God would give David what he needed for battle. For this reason, David writes in verse 7: "Some trust in chariots, and some in horses; But we will trust in the name of the LORD our God." Amen!!

In the same way that the people prayed for David's success, I pray for your success in fulfilling your bucket list this summer!! I pray that as you go through this season you may find places of peace and fun, places to connect your thoughts with God 's thoughts. I pray God that while you are searching for Him, He will guide you, protect you, and increase your ability to trust Him. God is the same forever and ever, and in the same way that He didn't leave David alone, He will not leave you alone and will grant you the desires of your heart. Amen!!

Please bring food items to the church and place them in the Loaves and Fishes bin inside the church OR leave your donations in the bin on the porch outside the New Life Center. These donations will be taken to the local food pantry to be distributed.

Suggestions to leave— Canned goods—soups, stews, fruits, vegetables, pasta sauces, meats.

Boxed foods—crackers, cereal, cake mixes, instant potatoes, mac and cheese, pancake mix, pasta, oatmeal, dinners.

Toiletries--toilet paper, soap, toothpaste, shampoo.

Baby needs-- baby food, cereal, diapers, juice.

Staples--flour, sugar, rice, dried beans.

Jars—peanut butter, jelly, applesauce, mayonnaise.

\*Please make sure the expiration date on the food has not expired and that the food does not need refrigeration.

This mission project provides school supplies, shoes, dental and hygiene items and Bibles to students in our community. We asked Unionville Elementary School, Fairview Elementary School and New Salem Elementary School to provide us with names of 12 families each who may need assistance.

If you are planning on donating supplies to the book bag mission please have them turned in to the church by Monday, July 6<sup>th</sup>. This will give me a month to order what is needed and get the bags packed. In addition, please contact Tanja at 704-242-2995 if you would be willing to help with this project on Saturday, August 8 from 9:00 am; Or if you would be able to help pack bags once supplies arrive. On Saturday, August 8, from 9:00 a.m.-11:00 a.m. the families will be invited to drive-thru and pick up their school supplies, shoes, Bibles and other items.

We will collect donated supplies and monetary donations during June and July. You may drop off your donations in the collection bin outside the New Life Center.

## Guidelines for In-Person Worship & Ministry During COVID-19

**Guiding Principles** 

Do No Harm. Do Good. Stay in Love with God.

Greetings, brothers and sisters, in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ:

As faithful disciples of Jesus Christ in the midst of our response to the COVID-19 pandemic, we remain committed to our biblical mandate to "love our neighbors as ourselves" and our Wesleyan call to "Do no harm. Do all the good we can. Follow the ordinances (stay in love) with God." In doing so, we seek ways to engage faithfully in worship, study, and ministry while ensuring the health and safety of our members and communities.

We celebrate the many ways you, as churches across Western NC, have been creative and innovative during this crisis in how you worship, reach, teach and serve in your communities.

As Bill Wilson, writing for the Center for Healthy Churches states in a recent article, "We will not be able to un-learn what we have learned about being the church going forward. Our new normal will see us regarding our physical location as one of many expressions of our church. In doing so, we will quite possibly become more of the gathered and scattered church Jesus had in mind for his followers."

Our mission has not changed (Matthew 28:16-20). We are called to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. This is still happening as we continue to find new ways to worship, connect, grow, serve, and give in the age of COVID-19.

We want to be in alignment with our scriptural and Wesleyan call to "love others" and "do no harm," and in compliance with public health guidance and governmental mandates.

We do not recommend returning to indoor worship for the foreseeable future, particularly as long as the percentage of positive Covid-19 tests and hospitalizations are not declining. You agree to accept the liability for doing otherwise.

Please use the following guidelines to lead your church safely during this in-between time, and for working with your transition team to plan for eventual indoor worship services. We covenant to continue to update you as conditions change in our local ministry areas.

So enjoy a drive out, you can sit in your car, bring a lawn chair or stand, we are practicing social distancing.


