Pastor Note

Our schedules, our priorities, and our rhythm of life normally change as we move through life. Doctors and health advisors recommend people to stay in a rhythm because it promotes health and wellness. Besides, they say, having a routine improves health, people can sleep better, improve their eating habits, and in general terms their health is better. Those are examples that encourage others to stay in a routine. Not so for the ones who lack rhythm in life, they are more prone to suffer more stress, and their mental health declines faster than the ones who have healthy habits or routines.

COVID 19 has changed our routines drastically, the self-isolation that we are experiencing has challenged us to confront a situation that we have never faced before, and all ages have been affected by the pandemic; from kindergarten to college, many of them have been required to changed to online learning. We also as members of a Christian community have been required to worship in many and different ways, away from our routines. We all have changed our rhythm of life, the way that we interact with one another, the way that we work, the way that we shop, and even the way we worship.

It would be beneficial when we are able to go back to our weekly or daily routine, our routine of work, our routine of rest, and our routine of the sabbath to remind ourselves that the daily and weekly routine was practiced by Jesus as well. Mark 1:21-34 teaches us that Jesus had his rhythm, beginning early in the mornings with prayer, when it was "still very dark" (v.35), in solitary places just to be in communion his father. Part of his daily habits was then to talk with God before the ministry of the new day.

As you know, on October 1st we started phase 3 on the reopening of the economy in our state, this is the time we were waiting to come, and with it, to resume our habits and routines of the ministry at the church as well.

I am excited to announce that we have planned to resume our indoor, in-person worship services on Sunday, October 18th @ 10:00 AM, and Sunday School @ 9:00 AM. All other regular activities of small groups and teams will resume as well in the following weeks. This includes the recording on Sunday morning of the worship service and it will be posted on Facebook right after worship, the recorded service will not be available until after 11:00 AM. Our last outdoor service is planned for Sunday, October 11th @ 8:30 AM.

However, this does not mean that if you feel you are not ready to join us in person yet you will miss worship. By no means, you still could follow us online through the pre-recorded service on Sundays after 11:00 AM on our Facebook page.

We thank God that the pandemic situation has come to a point in which we can resume many other activities with the proper following of the safety protocols using our masks, keeping safe distancing, and washing our hands often or using hand sanitizer. At the church, we are ready to welcome you following all these safety measures, and with the confidence that you will support this effort following them as well.

I look forward to seeing you at church and to nurture our souls as we gather together to praise the Lord. Only you know when the best time to come back is, and when you are ready we will welcome you to your church with love and gladness.
