One of the things that make Advent such a wonderful and memorable time of the year is the carols and the Christmas hymns. The same music year after year has been filling the hearts of the people for centuries with hope and joy.



Christians all around the world have the task of sharing the message of Jesus Christ to every corner of the world. We make the effort by sharing it through witness, through worship, and through missions, which is excellent! But this season the message of grace and truth that is found in Hymns and Carols "Christ is born in Bethlehem" is creatively spread through a gospel song that joyfully builds up the faith of all people each and every time they sing.

What more can we ask for this season as generations sing and internalize the deepest gospel revelation? The story of Jesus' birth will be told and retold in different cultures, in different languages, different places such as shopping stores, supermarkets, malls, and restaurants. The melodies and the hymns with the lyrics of the story of Jesus will resonate in the hearts of many, many people. There will be some that will listen to the melody and probably think that it is the sound of the sentiment of the holiday season. But there will be others that will wonder, marvel, and be inspired by the child, the holy savior that came to rescue the world.

Charles Wesley was inspired by the savior's message and the sounds of London church bells while walking to church on Christmas Day. He wrote the "Hark" poem about a year after his conversion to be read on Christmas Day. This poem, according to the story, appeared first in Hymns and Sacred Poems in 1739 with the opening line of "Hark", but in 1753, George Whitfield, a student and colleague of John and Charles Wesley, adapted the poem into the song we now sing today. It was Whitefield who added the phrase "Glory to the Newborn King!"

As you sing carols this Christmas, take the time to think about the message of the songs and what they mean. Consider the words you are singing and the truths they proclaim about the Savior. We hope that others not only may listen, but as well, be reminded of God's faithfulness of the past, the hope that this good news brings to the future, and the present grace that is now available to each of us in Christ. Amen!!


