Pastor Note

"After these things God tested Abraham and said to him, "Abraham!" And he said, "Here I am." He said, "Take your son, your only son Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains of which I shall tell you." So Abraham rose early in the morning, saddled his donkey, and took two of his young men with him, and his son Isaac. And he cut the wood for the burnt offering and arose and went to the place of which God had told him." Genesis 22:1-3

I am grateful to my Lord Jesus Christ for allowing us to celebrate the New Year 2021. Last year, we found ourselves facing huge battles; days were hard, circumstances around us were constantly changing, some people walk through difficult illnesses, others difficult losses, but no matter how hard it was, God's faithfulness followed us, God's mercies never ceased around us even during the pandemic. Now we begin a new year, and we need to face it again with the same attitude with hope and faith trusting that God has control, trusting in his promises. Like every year the struggles and circumstances will raise doubts in our hearts; will tell us that it will be a difficult year again; but still, we need to trust. God has chosen us in this time to be a beacon of peace and light during struggles.

Abraham was chosen by God to be a beacon of light in the darkness. The story of Abraham is familiar to us and we all know how difficult it was for Abraham to trust in God's promises, but as the scripture says, against all hope, in hope he believed in God. (Rom 4:18). Abraham was already an old man when God took him outside and said: "Now look at the heavens, and count the stars, if you can count them. So will your offspring be." (Gen15: 5.) Who can believe that? only a person who had lived close to God, or who has been friend with God, or who was able to recognize his voice. Abraham believed in God's promise, although naturally speaking it was impossible. Abraham and his wife Sarah had passed their childbearing years and had no children, so, his faith was tested with a promise, and regardless of what his reasoning told him, Abraham did not waver in his faith, as Paul says, God kept his promise (Romans 4:20). Sarah gave birth to a baby boy, and they named her son Isaac.

Now we know that Abraham was tested for a second time, and this test was, I guess, harder than the first one. Years later, when Isaac was a child, God spoke to Abraham again. "And he said: Take now your son, your only son, Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains that I will tell you." Genesis 22: 2. What was Abraham supposed to think about this? For sure none of this made sense for him; but Abraham's faith in God didn't change. Despite the situation he took action, he got up in the morning, saddled his donkey, cut the wood necessary for the burnt offering, and began the three-day journey through the mountains with Isaac (Genesis 22) We can imagine that he must have been tempted to have doubts, but he believed, without questioning he knew in his heart that God would keep his promise.

In the same way, this new year we might be tempted to think that it will be impossible to go back to the normal life, to do ministry in the way that we have done it, to serve in the way that we have been serving, even though our mind speaks with fear and doubt, our hearts if we trust, will speak with faith.

If you feel that God has given us a mission as an individual, or as part of the body of Christ, let us take action like Abraham, let us walk in faith knowing that God is in control. Yes, we may not be sure what the future will bring this 2021, but faith empowers us to keep moving in God's direction, trusting in God's plan. When we have the shield of faith we can also resist the thoughts of doubt that Satan tries to sow in our minds. Abraham decided to live by faith and obedience and because of that he is known as a father of the faith, (Rom 4).

Today, God is giving us a gift of life, a new opportunity to enjoy in his presence, to work for his kingdom, and as children of God, we can respond with faith. Just as Abraham made a difference in the lives of many people through faith and determination, we can also make a difference in this generation too, if we just give that step of faith knowing that the world will not only see our testimony, but will see that the God Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob is with us.

May the peace of God be with you this 2021!


- UMW will not have a meeting in the month of January



The conference is thrilled to partner with <u>Hinton Rural Life Center</u> to offer Youth Mental Health First Aid virtual training on January 26, 2021.

Youth Mental Health First Aid is designed to teach adults who regularly interact with young people how to help an adolescent (age 12-18) who is experiencing a mental health or addiction challenge or is in crisis. The course introduces common mental health challenges for youth, reviews typical adolescent development, and teaches a 5-step action plan for how to help young people in both crisis and non-crisis situations. Topics covered include anxiety, depression, substance use, disorders in which psychosis may occur, disruptive behavior disorders (including AD/HD), and eating disorders.

Each participant will be required to complete approximately 2 hours of independent pre-work then attend a 5.5-hour virtual live training event (includes lunch break) from 9:00am - 2:30pm on January 26, 2021.

The fee for this training is \$50 per person. Scholarships are available (as part of the online registration form).
