Pastor Note

"For to this, you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, so that you might follow in his steps. He committed no sin, neither was deceit found in his mouth." 1 Peter 2:21-22

I have had the opportunity to visit historical places in the US and abroad. It is an exciting experience to walk

in the places where those who made history have walked. And as you learn the stories of those heroes and communities, about their lives, and the events that they created, many times you are inspired by their bravery, their commitment, and their call to change their world. Six Weeks Bible Study beginning on Thursday, February, 24th.


in-person from 12:00 to 1:00 PM at the New Life Center and 5:30 PM via Zoom
