Pastor's Note

On July 23, the Olympic games in Tokyo started. I have seen some short videos of some of the events and I like to see the high levels of performance these athletes have. They do things that look very simple, but for me, it would be very hard to do some of the basic things they do with such grace and confidence.

When I think about these athletes many times, I wonder about their motivations to be at the Olympics. For example, the games are happening without the public, and that is not an exciting thing for the athletes, they cannot feel the emotion and the enthusiasm from the public. The public is one of the great strengths for the athletes to perform!

On the other hand, there is a risk of COVID-19 and Delta variant, and still, they want to be there. On other occasions, the games happen in times of war, in times of international conflicts, and in times of danger for many of the athletes, yet they want to go and perform.



The athletes don't care in what country the games will take place, they would go whatever they need to go, and again I wonder; what is their motivation, what makes the athletes training hard, and dedicate their lives to their disciplines and go wherever they need to go, in the circumstances that may be a danger for them and even under the personal risks for them?



I guess their motivations are so complex and diverse as it is with the motivations of believers in living their spiritual lives. When the apostle Paul compared our spiritual lives as a competition in a race where we have obstacles to jump, and yet we need to keep our sight on the goal, yes, that is hard. Spiritual life is a discipline that we are excited to live and share and perform with the best of our abilities.

We live a spiritual life during cultural challenges, social conflicts, and international events that affect our lives. We lead spiritual lives in times when we feel discouraged, tired, and many times even wondering about our capacity to live out our faith. Yet, there is something within us that keeps us ongoing, that makes us go wherever we need to go, to make us jump over those obstacles even when we know they are difficult, but that motivation keeps our focus on the goal.

Everyone has different motivations and reasons to live their spiritual lives, but there is one thing in

common, and that is that no matter how hard our spiritual lives are at times, there are rewards to everyone. Our assurance is that if in this life our spiritual performance is not as good as we wish, the final prices await for all of us, and then our reward will fill our spirits for eternity.

Enjoy your spiritual life, and perform it to the best of your abilities, and don't get discouraged by the challenges that it implies. God knows the intention of your hearts.



or call <u>1-800-733-2767</u> and request our drive


We will also take walk ins, however, the wait is usually less if the person has an appointment.
